- Resolve to Spend More Time on Your Job Search Job seeking is a 24/7 job. The
 more effort and time you put into your job search, the better your results will be. Read
 the newspaper help wanted ads, check online job sites, mail out resumes, set up
 interviews, and most of all work on your network of contacts! It takes time to find a
 new job. It takes even more time to find a really good job.
- Resolve to Stay Organized This New Year's Resolution is a great one for the job seeker too! Grab a planner and be sure to write down any upcoming appointments or job interviews, and be sure to always be on time. Employers like to hire job seekers who are reliable and punctual. Develop These Positive Habits to Succeed on The Job
