Summer Job Opportunities for Young Adults

Are you age 14-20? Do you want a summer job? The Oswego CountyWorkforce New York Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) may have a job for you! This program is open to young adults (age 14-20) who are residents of Oswego County AND meets at *least one* of the following criteria:

- Low household income
- Currently receiving:
 - TANF (Cash Public Assistance)
 - SNAP (Food Stamps)
 - Medicaid
 - HEAP
- Currently in Foster Care

IMPORTANT!!!

All applicants must attend a work readiness/payroll enrollment workshop AND an Oswego County employee orientation session.

The Oswego County Workforce New York Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) provides paid work and job readiness training to empower young people (income eligible, 14-20 years of age) to develop their work interests, skills, and abilities. Participants earn their own money, build a resume, gain professional references, and reinforce productive work habits and positive attitudes. Eligible applicants may be offered paid employment at the current NYS minimum wage (\$15.00 per hour) for up to 30 hours per week from early July to the middle of August.

SYEP provides a variety of opportunities throughout the county, but placements may be limited in some areas. The work sites include local school districts, community-based organizations and Oswego County Conservation Corps (OC3) landscaping crews. Job opportunities include clerical trainee, custodial trainee, recreational program helper, OC3 crew member and more.

Public, private and not-for-profit employers are encouraged to apply as work sites too!

Recognize Burnout Before It Flares

Do you feel constantly tired and irritated by work? You may be burning out. The symptoms of burnout are as varied as those who suffer it. Some people get angry, some become quiet and introverted, while others overeat or abuse drugs and alcohol.

If your job is stressful, find out if you're headed for job burnout. Some common feelings associated with burnout are:

- You feel unable to be effective at work.
- The workplace demands more than you are able to give.
- Nothing you do seems good enough.
- You are anxious and dread going to work.
- You are always tired, even when you get enough sleep.
- You're bored most or all of the time.
- You feel guilty.
- You feel hopeless, powerless, and frustrated.

Here are some of the best defenses against burnout:

- Take care of yourself. Eat a healthy, balanced diet, and get enough rest and exercise.
- Make balance a priority. Have a rich life outside of work, as well as activities and people who bring you satisfaction outside of the office.
- Reach out for help. Build a strong support system, and make sure you're not with people who spend time complaining.
- Come up with solutions. If you sense a problem, follow through on all possible remedies you develop.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Be consistently working a minimum of 30 hours per week OR accepted a new job with a minimum of 30 hours per week
- Resident of Oswego County and a US citizen or legally authorized to work in the US
- · Be income eligible.
- · Have a valid Driver's License
- Vehicle must meet title, registration, and insurance requirements
