Career Guidance

Oswego County Workforce New York offers a wide range of services to help you reach your employment goals including Career Guidance.

Are you currently working, but want something different? Many people come into our office wanting a change, but just do not know how to go about it.

Are you not sure of labor market outlook for a career you are interested in? Our staff can inform you of the current demand for the job you are looking for, and help you identify what skills you need to qualify for that job. Staff can also help you to identify skills (called transferable skills) you already have which would apply to that occupation. They can also offer suggestions for upgrading your skills, including potential training opportunities.

Our staff can also review your resume and make suggestions to help your transition to your new career.

Another option to help you upgrade your skills is the Metrix Online Learning System. Metrix provides courses on a wide variety of topics and can be done at your own pace. If interested, please see a staff person to sign up for a Metrix orientation where an overview of the system will be provided.

Other types of training opportunities can also be explored. On-the-job training (OJT) provides you with the ability to learn as you earn that much needed paycheck. Classroom training is another option that is appropriate in some cases

Give Yourself a Job Review

From time to time, you may want to give yourself a job performance appraisal. It may help you prepare for a formal review by your supervisor, if your employer conducts these regularly. It could also help you see yourself as your supervisor sees you—and, thus, enable you to decide whether putting in for a promotion or raise is justified. At the very least, it can give you a feeling about areas you need to shore up to make you worthy of a better job or a pay increase in the future.

- Write it down- A self-appraisal will work best if you put it in writing. List
 your strengths and successes, your failures and weaknesses. Put your
 first draft aside for a day or two and come back to it, until you are
 satisfied that you have touched all bases
- satisfied that you have touched all bases.

 Be honest-To make such an appraisal worthwhile, you have to be honest with yourself. You have to look at yourself critically. Making excuses or clossing over faults will render the exercise meaningless. a waste of time.
- glossing over faults will render the exercise meaningless, a waste of time.

 Be fair— Don't be hard on yourself. You should make allowances for circumstances beyond your control—as your supervisor probably would. Changing conditions or unforeseen developments could make it hard to meet target dates. Don't let yourself off the hook too easily, either.

Here are the kinds of questions you should be asking yourself:

- 1. How have you been doing your job? Have you lived up to your supervisor's (and your own) expectations? Have you accomplished what your job descriptions calls for? Did you accept the responsibilities and fulfill them?
- 2. How did you do on major, specific assignments? Did you comply with all requirements? Did you meet all deadlines? Did you have to be prompted or reminded to get going?
- or reminded to get going?
 3. Have you improved on the job, learned additional skills and taken on greater responsibilities?
- 3. Have you improved on the jost, seemed greater responsibilities?
 4. What can or should you do in the future to improve your job performance? Be specific.

After you are finished, ask your supervisor for a few minutes for a private discussion of your job performance. See if his/her appraisal matches yours. If it doesn't, you may be ready for bigger and better things. If it doesn't, you may want to do some rethinking about what you can do about any shortcomings he points out.
